TITLE: BIBS Lesson 1 – Approach Bible Study By Uncovering the Author's Intent

TEXT: 2 Tim 3:13-17

I. Read

A. We call this the BIG IDEA BIBLE STUDY

- 1. Typically might preach more
- 2. This series teaching HOW to do the Bible study
- 3. After tonight, simply talking ABOUT Bible study in general
 - a) The other parts of the series will go through
 - b) Observation, interpretation, application
 - c) And all the steps and tools that go into each of those
- 4. We'll go through a lot of info but it will seem basic to some
 - a) as if you already know all this.
 - b) You probably do.
- 5. I want every minute of the Bible study series to be beneficial
 - a) I despise lectures that I pretty much already know and believe.
- 6. I always want to learn things that are new, so I'm sharing with you things that my partially know,
 - a) but hopefully we'll have plenty of benefit to you.

- 7. I have witnessed it in laypeople, Bible students, and even preachers.
 - a) So it seems to me that no matter who you are, this can help you.
- 8. BIBS book intro preacher told us to read our Bible.
 - a) We WANT to, but we don't know how.
- 9. New Christian
 - a) Old Christian think people should expect, but you don't know how.
 - b) You've never been trained
 - c) Or, you're self-trained, but you feel like you sometimes still don't understand it
- 10. Or, you're a seasoned Christian and you've been studying Scripture for years.
 - a) This BIBS method can help all of us, even you.
 - b) If anything, it is just a different, fresh approach to Scripture.
- 11. I'm really trying to make it beneficial to everyone.
 - a) So tonight we'll introduce a bunch of concepts
 - b) Then in the future weeks we will further explain and expand each concept

B. **2 Tim 3:13-17**

- 1. We will get to these verses a bit later
- 2. Won't take time on the WHOLE passage like we normally would
- C. PRAY

- II. Most church-goers might rate themselves well on a Bible knowledge test.
 - A. Comparatively speaking, you might know more than the new Christian or the average church member of another kind of church.
 - 1. You might score high in Bible Trivial Pursuit games,
 - 2. you might have memorized a lot of Scripture, or
 - 3. you might know a lot of Bible stories from having taught them for years to children.
 - B. To be candid, I used to think so, myself.
 - 1. I had memorized several full chapters of the Bible for Bible quiz teams,
 - 2. and in Awana
 - 3. I had grown up hearing the stories taught
 - a) I was even called to preach just after graduation.
 - b) I was a PK
 - 4. I felt like, sure, I didn't know everything—everyone knows that—but I still felt at least knowledgeable.
 - C. And you might be like me in that.
- III. It wasn't until college that I had a whole new way of even VIEWING the Bible

- A. I'm sure it was taught to me earlier than college, but I never got it, apparently.
- B. Because I still viewed the Bible merely as a collection of stories.
 - 1. It was just "Bible" stuff
 - 2. In "Bible" language
- C. And when I said, "In Bible times..." I just meant... ALL of ancient history.
 - 1. I didn't realize that "Bible Times" meant a span of thousands of years.
- D. I mean, Adam had sons and daughters.
 - 1. I'm guessing he had a son or grandson near the end of his life.
 - 2. Each of these guys are living to be about a thousand years old!
- E. So Jesus lived about 2000 years ago, and we think THAT is ancient history.
 - 1. That's NOTHING!
 - 2. I mean, 2000 years is just two guys' lifetimes. That's pretty short.
 - 3. But I never really thought like that
- F. Also, I never thought of MEN actually writing the Scripture.
 - 1. I never thought of the Bible as LITERATURE

- 2. I never realized that Paul was so educated
- 3. and he used the style of his day
- 4. He was a blogger!
- G. He used the latest tips and tricks of the Greek language to preach and write
- IV. YES, God wrote the Bible.
 - A. It's an IMPOSSIBLE book without God.
 - B. But he did not write it completely OUTSIDE man.
 - 1. He wrote it by USING man.
 - C. I never realized how beautiful ancient poetry could be
 - D. I never realized how rich the **Psalms** were until I started to understand that that's how people communicated.
 - E. I never understood why the **historical** books were useful, or so full of detail
 - 1. until I read it from THEIR perspective FIRST.
- V. See, I always looked for ME first.
 - A. I looked for Bible Truth that could help me.
 - B. So the story of **David** was about
 - 1. what I could learn from what HE did.
 - C. I approached his **Psalms** as a message from God written **ONLY** to me.
 - 1. I emphasize ONLY.

- 2. Because it wasn't ONLY written to me.
- 3. It was written to someone else, first.
- D. What I was doing was actually an upside-down approach to Scripture.
 - 1. I was trying to search for ME first, and I would end up confused
 - 2. Or worse, wrong!
- E. I would arrive at conclusions that I thought were GOD'S
 - 1. Because, after all, "I got it from the Bible"
 - 2. But were entirely inaccurate.
 - 3. Because I started with ME in mind.
- F. Have you done that?
 - 1. We all understand that the Scriptures are valuable and beneficial.
 - 2. No matter what, we can learn from them
- G. But be careful about taking EVERY text everywhere
 - 1. And making it mean something TO YOU.
 - 2. You need to FIRST understand it from GOD'S perspective
- H. Then take it home to yourself.
- VI. See, I don't mean to make this a HUMAN book.

- A. Or somehow lessen its importance
 - 1. Or power in our lives
 - 2. Or authority
- B. In fact, it's an IMPOSSIBLE book
 - 1. If it were human
 - 2. We would NEVER have this book if it were up to humans
- C. This IS God's Word supernatural
 - 1. And we have good evidence to support that claim
- VII. The prophecies alone get me
 - A. There are about <u>61</u> prophecies about the man Jesus Christ
 - B. Mathematicians have calculated 8 of them
 - 1. Just 8
 - 2. Not all 60+
 - 3. Just 8
 - C. If 8 predictions were to come true in ONE MAN
 - 1. As they did in the historical human name Jesus Christ
 - D. The probability is 1 in <u>100,000,000,000,000,000</u>
 - 1. That's <u>17</u> zeros!

2. !) If you cover the state of <u>Texas</u> in that many half-dollars, you would have a pile 2 feet deep. Now mark one, blindfold someone and have him find your mark

VIII. It is a supernatural book

- A. It's the book of God
- B. It's the book that keeps you on the straight and narrow
 - 1. But you have to be IN IT!
- C. See, Timothy had Paul as a mentor,
 - 1. We might think that's a benefit
 - 2. But we've got it better than him!
- D. We have the benefit of reading over Timothy's shoulder!
 - 1. And Paul's advice to Timothy is no different than the advice he'd give you today!
- IX. V12 you're going to be persecuted, Timothy
 - A. ALL who live godly will
- X. V13 and the world gets worse and worse
 - A. It's a horrible place to live!
- XI. BUT V14 BUT continue thou...
 - A. Keep going in them!
 - 1. What things?

- B. The things you've been taught since boyhood
 - 1. Mom and grandma
- C. What's the BEST thing you learned from your godly heritage?!
 - 1. The SCRIPTURES!
 - 2. The holy scriptures
- D. They are able to make you wise to salvation
 - 1. Through faith in Christ Jesus
- XII. Here's a verse we all know: V16
 - A. All Scripture is given by inspiration of God
 - 1. No matter where
 - 2. No matter what text
 - 3. God breathed it
 - B. He had a particular problem he was addressing
 - 1. A sin to fix
 - 2. A truth to believe
 - 3. A people to encourage
 - C. Knowing WHY Scripture was FIRST SPOKEN is half the battle.
 - 1. Paul says THIS is what you need to live godly lives
 - 2. This is ALL you need!

3. Because it addresses ALL needs!

XIII. God cares enough about communicating to us – progressively

- A. That he gave us His Word
 - 1. Adam he spoke directly to
 - 2. Noah he spoke to
 - 3. Moses he spoke to
 - 4. But then Moses preached AND wrote
- B. God spoke through His Word the Law
 - 1. When things weren't addressed in the law
 - 2. They were brought to Moses
- *C.* The judges
- D. The kings
- E. The prophets
 - 1. God spoke
 - 2. The Prophets preached
 - 3. And then, usually, the prophets wrote down their sermons
- F. On and on
- G. In the New Testament
 - 1. Men lived with Christ

- 2. They watched him live and die
- 3. They were first-hand witnesses
- 4. They SAW it
 - a) God told them to write their stories
- H. So they did
 - 1. With their take on it
 - 2. With their intention
 - 3. With an audience
 - 4. Written to people
- I. Then churches were established
 - 1. Based on the authority of
 - a) Christ
 - b) Apostles
 - c) Scripture
 - 2. And eye-witnesses of Christ, including Paul,
 - a) Wrote with GOD'S authority
 - b) To churches
 - c) To Pastors
 - d) To Christians
- J. For a purpose.

- 1. But progressively.
- 2. God spoke a little.
- 3. Man wrote a little
- 4. Man had questions, God had already spoken: "Search the Word."
- 5. Man: But it's not there?
- 6. God: "Here's more instruction."
- XIV. God SPOKE. It's our FIRST duty as Bible studiers
 - A. To know what God SAID.
 - 1. This is a book of the PAST, PRESENT and FUTURE
 - B. But it was PENNED in the past
 - C. Definition: The Bible is the Word of God, progressively penned by Divinely inspired humans to eternally convey God's thoughts to man.
 - D. The Bible is complete.
 - 1. It's our duty as Christians now to study out what God <u>SAID</u>
 - 2. To find out **what God is <u>SAYING</u>** still today and for our future.
- XV. So, I call this the BIBS method
 - A. It's simple enough
 - 1. Because it's broken down into several easy-tounderstand steps

- B. But it's still profound
 - 1. Deep
 - 2. Like a mine
- C. And the BIBS method gets you into basic Bible hermeneutics or interpretation.
- XVI. BTW, I'm not even saying it's the RIGHT approach.
 - A. This is an INDUCTIVE study, meaning that we are taking the pieces and **building something bigger**.
 - 1. We're funneling data down to a point.
 - a) A big idea.
 - 2. We're reading, and discovering a point
 - a) Just like a THANK YOU LETTER has a central point
 - b) And a business letter has a point,
 - c) So does the Bible
 - B. We're not starting with a point and running to Scripture to try to back it up.
- XVII. I think BIBS is correct, because sometimes we get Bible study upside down.
 - A. "I've got this really good topic I want to share... now if only I could find a text that would back me up."
 - B. Or, "I know people who need to hear a sermon on prayer (or music, or...) and now I need to go find a text.

XVIII. You know what's a LOT easier?

- A. What's a lot easier is this...
 - 1. "Hm... where am I in my Bible reading today?
 - 2. Oh... James...
 - 3. Oh... 2 Chronicles.
 - 4. Oh... Ezra.
 - 5. Oh, Leviticus...
 - 6. Oh, 1 John...
 - 7. I'm excited to learn today what God SAID, and what He is still SAYING to me today."
- XIX. Great courses Analyzing ancient literature (secular)
 - A. "Analysis and Critique" course by Tilar Mazeo.
 - 1. Literature scholar and professor instructing on how to read, analyze and critique a text, whether it is poetry, drama, short story, college essay or what have you.
 - B. Each passage can be critiqued, analyzed, picked apart to find its benefit and meaning.
 - 1. Author intent is huge.
 - 2. The yellow wallpaper. History of the writer. It's a paper about gender inequality.
 - C. Why are people so good at finding author intent in literature

- 1. But never give it a thought
- 2. When it comes to the MOST important piece of literature ever?
- XX. Just finished the autobiography of Ben Franklin
 - A. Ben Franklin was turned off to religion in general because a preacher mishandled the Word of God
 - 1. Presbyterian. "Preached so as to make the congregation Presbyterian instead of the Bible literate."
 - 2. Made Philippians 4:8-9 say that we should remember Sabbath, keep the sacraments, stay in church and other statements.
 - a) He said "I should have stayed on longer if he were a better preacher."
 - B. All because a preacher
 - 1. Made the text say what HE wanted to say
 - 2. Instead of letting GOD speak through the text
- XXI. It's a supernatural book.
 - A. And it claims to want to help you.
 - B. AND, it claims to have ALL the answers you could ever need.
 - 1. It's never let me down
 - 2. I know a lot of other people who would say the same thing

- C. So do the work of learning how to study it
- XXII. I have a section of books on my shelves
 - A. Baptist history
 - 1. Baptist distinctives
 - 2. Took the classes
 - 3. Took the notes
 - B. And forgot all of it
 - 1. Until one day I was confronted by a man from another type of religion,
 - 2. It forced me into those books to get it for MYSELF
 - 3. I put in a lot of time studying.
 - C. More books Teen devotionals
 - 1. I was SURE they would make me a good Christian
 - 2. Until they just sat there
 - 3. I'd read them every so often, but never took the time to make it personal.
 - 4. I FELT good, having the library, but it DID me NO good since I wasn't using it.
 - D. But it was kind of a false hope
- XXIII. I don't mean for this BIBS series to give you a false hope
 - A. Don't trust the METHOD

- B. And don't assume that THIS will be your Cure-All for your life
 - 1. This Bible study stuff still takes a lot of WORK!
 - 2. Thinking!
 - 3. Studying
 - 4. Reading!
 - 5. Uuugh!
- C. But I'm praying that this method can HELP you
 - 1. If you're willing to do the work.
